HISTORIC NOTES

The A.D. Foote – Luther Burbank Connection

The Foote family has often told us about A.D. Foote's interest in Luther Burbank and his many hybrids. Burbank's thornless blackberry variety, "Sebastopol," still grows on the North Star property.

It is understandable that A.D. Foote and Burbank would have had much in common. A.D. Foote was also a hybridizer as evidenced by his holly trees. But we have often wondered how Foote and Burbank came in contact with each other.

Luther Burbank and A.D. Foote were both members of the University Club of San Francisco in the early 1900's. William Bourne II and David Starr of the Empire Mine were members during this same time period. A.D. Foote was also a life member of the 6,400 member Luther Burbank Society that formed in 1912 to help publicize Burbank's research. Each member of the society was asked to proof a chapter of Burbank's book, *Luther Burbank: His Methods and Discoveries and Their Practical Application*.

With the help of the Luther Burbank House and Gardens Association, we are attempting to ascertain whether Foote contributed to Burbank's book by investigating the thornless blackberry.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE... CONTINUED

Since the North Star House and about 14 acres of land were set aside and dedicated to its preservation in 2004, this building is slowly being restored to resemble the California Arts and Crafts architectural gem it was in 1905. Now, for the next important step in 2014.....the NSHC wishes to open this vital piece of our local history to the public. Our vision for the North Star House and property is that it evolves into a community event center open to all. The North Star House and grounds could be used for public or private events including weddings, conferences, educational classes, theatrical or musical performances and the display of arts.

To this end, the NSHC has prepared a Master Plan for the property, which not only seeks to restore and rehabilitate the North Star House and grounds, but allows it to be opened to the public in a phased approach. On January 16, 2014, the NSHC filed a series of applications with Nevada County seeking approval of the Master Plan and a zoning designation that allows public access to this historic property. It is anticipated that our applications will be presented before the Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors in July – August. We are hopeful that the County will be supportive of our efforts and our applications would be approved. It will take time to implement the Master Plan and we will need the support of our members, neighbors, businesses and government leaders to achieve our goals.



EXCITING PROGRESS AT THE STAR...

LET THE WATER FLOW! The new septic system for the House is completed. This is the major first step to getting indoor plumbing back in the house for the first time in over 30 years! Many thanks to the work of the folks at Mohr's Excavation for doing such a fine job and completing their work on schedule. Comfort Plumbing has now taken over and is working their magic inside the house as part of the preparation to the kitchen and bathroom work currently underway.

THE IS COMPLETED! The new work shop is completed! Thanks to Steve Becker and crew, Bill Haire and Trail Crew from the Bear Yuba Land Trust, Tim Colbert and David Wright! We now have a place to store the tractor and can begin building workbenches and cabinets. We are also grateful to the timely donation of siding materials from Bill Trabucco that helped us keep the cost of the shop much lower than planned.



DOORWAY MASONRY REPAIR WORK NEARS COMPLETION: Volunteers are working to repair sagging masonry over the doorway to the kitchen. It is a testament to the design and construction of the house that this is the first masonry repair of this type we have had to do since we acquired the House. Thanks to Larry Dulmage, Don Dumas, and David Wright for their timely work on this project.

VOLUNTEERS MAKE A DIFFERENCE!

The work of the North Star Historic Conservancy continues to move forward with the help of hard working and dedicated board members and volunteers. Our dedicated *volunteers have donated over 20,000 hours* towards reaching our goals since the Conservancy was formed. Each issue of the "Star" introduces some of these amazing volunteers.

Ron Mathis was a founding member of the Board of Directors of The North Star Historic Conservancy and served as its treasurer until early 2014. He was a member of the Nevada County Land Trust Board of Directors from 1996 to 2008 where he served as board president and treasurer, and worked hard to help the land trust acquire the House. THREE HERITAGE ROSES RETURN TO THE NORTH STAR HOUSE

The grounds of the original North Star House included a rose garden in the patio area, which was a favorite of the original owner of the house, A.D. Foote. In 2005, three heritage roses were found in this garden, Baronne Provost, Dainty Bess, and an unidentified red rose. With the help of Lee Dempsey, our rose expert, these roses were cared for, propagated, and finally planted in March 2014 in the rose garden of the Gardener's Cottage, now the Bear Yuba Land Trust

office.



Another heritage rose, Catherine Mermet, was planted in the garden in 2011. In her

autobiography, Mary Hallock Foote mentions that this rose grew at the North Star Cottage in the 1890's.

Both the Catherine Mermet and the Baronne Provost roses were sold by Felix Gillet's Barren Hill Nursery in Nevada City (1880-1910), and indeed the North Star roses may have been purchased there.
