







### My Visit to Mary Hallock Foot's Hometown

Mary Hallock Foote was the wife of Arthur DeWint Foote, mining engineer and superintendent of the North Star Mine. Theirs was the first family to live in the Julia Morgan designed North Star House. Mary Hallock Foote is recognized as a leading American illustrator and author.

In the summer of 2012, I visited Mary Hallock Foote's hometown of Milton, Ulster County, New York. Milton is located on the Hudson River about 75 miles north of New York City. Mary's father built the family home in the 1800's, and Mary was born there in November of 1847. The home eventually became the Carlton Inn, and today is privately owned.



Because of the riverboats, nearby train station, and the early road system, the Hallock family was well-located for entertaining famous guests. Visitors to the home included Susan B. Anthony and Frederick Douglass, surely providing stimulating, if controversial, conversation.

Mary was educated at home until the age of thirteen when she enrolled in the Poughkeepsie Female Seminary, which later became Vasser College. In 1864 she was accepted at the Cooper School of Design for Women in New York City. There she studied fine arts, color, engraving, and illustration techniques...all skills that she utilized in her lifetime of book and periodical illustration.
