In 2006, the NSHC was created to restore and manage the North Star House and the historic grounds. Much has occurred since that date NSHC was created.....

As many will recall, the North Star House sat vacant and deteriorating to the point of collapse. The surrounding grounds were littered with debris, garbage and illegal structures. What has occurred over the last 10 years is one of the more remarkable stories of perseverance and dedication for our County. After years of volunteer labor and an infusion of donated funds and materials, the House and grounds have been preserved and now are being converted into a cultural event center for all to enjoy.

The North Star House and its surrounding grounds contain a unique and rare legacy. The progress that has occurred over the last 10 years is a testament to our community and its commitment to protect this legacy for future generations. The advances made in continued pg 2

rehabilitating and restoring these historic features were only made possible by the many people who donated their time, labor and money.
One major accomplishment our Board can proudly state will occur, is that the North Star House will be open for public tours and visits during set hours in 2017. Our remodel work on the lower floor includes new plumbing, electrical and heating systems for the House, allowing the interior to be available year-round for public use. It is still difficult to believe that the North Star House has transitioned from near ruin to an open and operating historic event venue, where the interior can be rented for receptions, retreats, educational classes and tours provided to the public.
The progress of transforming this property into a premier cultural event center continues. For 2017, aside from opening the House for regular office hours and public tours, NSHC will be working on these important projects:

- Rebuild, repair and re-shingle the entire front (east-facing side) of the House;
- Rehabilitate and restore the Library and Julia Morgan Room;
- Work to complete the Heritage Garden, complete with installation of solar panels; and
- Improve our roadways, parking areas, lighting and signage.

Your continued support is needed, now more than ever, so a number of these critical improvements can be made. All of our 2017 improvements further advance our mission to open the property for public access and use.

In closing, the recognition of a milestone is a unique opportunity to build a sense of appreciation, well-being and inspiration into the core of an organization's culture. It also allows our organization, the NSHC, to say thank you to the community who made it happen.

Heritage Garden Update By Betzi Hart

The Heritage Garden at The North Star House is taking shape.

The final retaining wall was recently completed by Ron Bailey Masonry. The plans call for a Chinese Elm tree to be planted to shade the circular portion of the bench. Additional seating will be furnished by four Western Red Cedar benches - to be built by our own Larry Dulmage. Each bench will display a memorial plaque.

The Heritage Garden is going "solar"! A gift from Gil Mathews of Plan it Solar, is making it possible for our garden's power needs to be generated by the sun. The solar system

Jim Pyle, Carole Miller and Paula Campbell have been preparing a planting plan for the Heritage Garden. However, before the planting can take place, a shade pergola surrounding the center tree needs to be erected. We are looking for volunteers to help with construction.

## Deborah Gilcrest is NSHC's

## First Paid Staff Member

In addition to bookkeeping and contract administration at North Star House, Deborah works part time as a Clerk/Analyst at Nevada LAFCo. Deborah is a graduate of the University of Alaska, Anchorage, and completed post-graduate work in theatre and drama therapy.

While working in rural Alaska as a Community Planner, Deborah had her first exposure to the challenges of preserving an historic building. She partnered with other government officials and community leaders (in the Yukon-Kuskokwim Delta) to protect the BIA school which had been scheduled for demolition. The school was constructed in the mid-20th century to perpetuate the western education of Native Alaskan children; which represented a significant cultural shift for the region.

When Deborah accepted a position at the Kenai Peninsula Borough, she and her colleagues developed a Habitat Protection Ordinance for the Kenai River.

She also organized the first Statewide Oil and Gas Stakeholders meeting (hosted by the Mayor's office), and soon thereafter was assigned to organize the Western States Planners Conference.

For three consecutive years Deborah served as Chair on the Board of Directors for a women's health clinic in Soldotna. Along with fellow board members and a large cadre of volunteers, Deborah was responsible for the clinic's annual fundraiser; which was the largest percentage of the operating budget. As Development Director for the Alaska Conservation Alliance, Deborah educated voters on the agency's mission and sought funding sources.

Deborah is honored to partner with the very committed NSHC Board of Directors - whose worthy goal is the preservation of one of Northern California's most significant legacies.
